Dear Friends,

The penitential season of Lent is ending. I do hope it has provided you with an opportunity for reflection. None of us can risk complacency about 'laying up treasure in heaven.'

I recently picked up my old and worn copy of C.S.Lewis' Screwtape Letters and a passage in it prompted me consider what we call 'sins of omission', the 'things we have left undone.' When considering our shortcomings, I think there is a natural tendency to pay more attention to 'the things we ought not to have done', and overlook 'the things we ought to have done.'

The passage opens with Screwtape suggesting to his nephew Wormwood, an apprentice devil, that he can ease up on offering pleasures as temptations to his 'patient' if he can instead simply establish in him the habit of doing nothing. 'Nothing' Screwtape says is very strong, "strong enough to steal away a man's best years not in sweet sins but in a dreary flickering of the mind over it knows not what and knows not why, in the gratification of curiosities so feeble that the man is only half aware of them, in drumming of fingers and kicking of heels, in whistling tunes that he does not like."

These 'nothings' may appear to be small, inconsequential sins but what matters is how by their cumulative effect they separate the 'patient' from God. Sins can be no more than 'nothings', they don't have to be 'spectacular wickedness', and still cut us off from God. Screwtape concludes by telling Wormwood that, when it comes to temptations that he might throw at his patient, "murder (a spectacular sin) is no better than cards if cards can do the trick. Indeed, the safest road to hell is the gradual one – the gentle slope, soft underfoot, without sudden turnings, without milestones, without signposts."

When our children were teenagers we would be happy to see them when they came home from school. But it seemed as if we would never learn. Our greeting was always, "Hey. What did you do at school today?" The response was always, "Huh! Nothing". And, with that, the conversation was over. Of course, they had done plenty but they did not want to admit that one would do anything consequential at school so the response was always "nothing".

How frightening to think that we might arrive at the gate of heaven where St. Peter asks, "So what did you do with your life?" and our response is, "Huh! Nothing."

I am the first to admit that I mindlessly troll through the internet, watch cable news for a glimpse of a nugget of information which is probably not true, day-dream or alternatively worry about things that that will never happen. Those things amount to a lot of 'nothing' but they take up time which could be spent on a good book or a conversation with someone who would appreciate my time or most importantly prayer. 'Nothing' is leading to too many sins of omission.

Our faith teaches us that our lives are a gift from God and he intends that we should use them to do something, not nothing.

I look forward to seeing you in Church as we come to the end of Lent and turn to the Passion and to Easter.

PARISH SURVEY

Four and a half years ago, when Fr. Paul was our Interim Rector we were in the search for a new Rector, the Vestry engaged HolyCow! Consulting to help take the temperature of the congregation and plan for the future. The Vestry believes it is important to receive your input into the life of the Church on a regular basis. Father Paul has now been with us close to five years and it is helpful to him also to know what the congregation is thinking. The vestry has therefore engaged HolyCow! to help us again. The results of the survey will be made available to all of you.

We hope you will participate in an online congregational assessment. This assessment will provide a clear picture of who we are as a church and what directions are most important for our future. The tool we'll use is the Congregation Assessment Tool (CAT), which will provide key indicators of our congregational health along with areas of challenge and potential growth. It will help us to collect and understand the range of views that exist at All Saints' and the possibilities, willingness, capacity and energy for moving our ministry into the future.

If you have provided us with a current email address, within the next few days, you will receive a unique web link to complete the assessment online. If you would prefer to take the assessment using a paper copy, please stop by the office, and we will provide one for you along with a self-addressed stamped envelope.

NOTE: If there is only one email address for all members of your household, it may be tempting to have one person take the survey on behalf of the family. However, please

be sure your spouse and all young adults living in your home have an opportunity to complete the survey. INDIVIDUAL INPUT is key to our gaining insight into overall perceptions and experiences.

Please set aside enough time to answer all the questions. This will take about 20 minutes. All survey responses are strictly anonymous.
