Dear Friends,

On Wednesday March 21 at 6:00-7:15 all of you are invited to what I am styling "a conversation" with Father Will Brown and his fiancé, Katie. This will take place in the Parish Hall.

I am considering Will+ as a potential Associate Rector. I say "I am considering" because the call to an Associate is made by the Rector and an Associate serves and reports to the Rector. Of course, the Vestry have been part of this and I want them to remain very much part of the process. I also want to know what you think of Will+ and that is the goal of this conversation, that you will have a chance to meet him, listen to him introduce himself, ask him questions and then give me your feedback.

Will+ is a Georgia native and was ordained in the Diocese of Georgia. He has been a priest for 12 years and currently serves in the Diocese of Dallas. He graduated from Sewanee as a philosophy major and went to seminary at Berkeley Divinity School which is at Yale. He was awarded a Master of Sacred Theology degree by Yale University.

I want to address some questions which I know this will raise. Why, all of a sudden, are we talking about an Associate Rector? Is All Saints' big enough to warrant two ordained staff members? What will an Associate Rector do? How long will an Associate stay? Does this mean Father Paul is getting ready to leave us?

Let me address those last two questions first.

I am not getting ready to leave. I remain excited and engaged and, blessedly, am healthy. In fact, there are aspects of my ministry which have developed over the last year which have been particularly gratifying. Especially, I see the emergence of lay spiritual leadership in the congregation which I want to support and encourage. I think the strongest churches are those in which both spiritual and temporal leadership are shared between the clergy and the laity. My plan, which I have shared with the vestry, is, God willing, to remain Rector until January 2023 when I will be 72 and by the Church canons must retire.

How long will an Associate stay? No-one can answer that question. This is not a 'term limited' appointment. How long an Associate might stay depends on 'fit' for them and

their family and for us, and whether other opportunities arise. Those are matters that are best left to the Holy Spirit.

So, why all of a sudden are we talking about an Associate Rector? The question of how the parish is best staffed is one that the vestry regularly considers. At our most recent planning session it was a topic that we explored at length, talking both about lay and clergy staff. Will's name came up through connections to our All Saints' family and it turned out that he was planning to be in Moultrie visiting a cousin. This seemed so serendipitous that I felt we should meet him while he was in the area. So, I called him to feel out his possible interest in All Saints'. He agreed to extend his stay in Moultrie so that we could talk face to face. He met with me and Cynthia and I took him out to dinner with our Senior Warden, Julie Carico, and her husband John. Philip and Alston Watt put him up at Osceola and spent time with him. All who met him thought that he would be just the kind of priest who would do well at All Saints' and in Thomasville. We shared that with the vestry last Wednesday and I was asked to see if he would come back with his fiancé to meet the entire vestry and the parish.

Is All Saints' big enough to warrant two full-time priests? Will+ and I have talked about that and I believe that we can complement each other's ministry in such a way that we do not trip over each other. If we do that successfully the Church will benefit from having both of us. In particular, he is much younger than me and will be the peer of the young parents in our congregation, so we have already talked about a focus for him being ministry to our young families.

Obviously, there is the question of how to afford an extra salary. I feel strongly that the vestry will need to tackle that issue in such a way that it does not add to uncertainty over whether we will be able to make our budget. It will require new sources of income beyond what we currently receive through gifts and pledges. I have told Will+ this because I do not want to be leading him on. He and his fiancé have their wedding planned for early May and they will want to know where their home will be. They are willing to come and visit with us knowing that it may not be financially possible.

What I am asking you to do is to pray about this and then come and meet Will+ and Katie on March 21st. It is a very important issue and potentially a wonderful opportunity for our Church. We just need to discern God's will.
