Dear Friends,

Next to the porch where I sit while dinner is cooking is a small, dense oak tree. I imagine it was planted when our house was built which would make it fifteen years old. The oak tree is home to at least one family of catbirds. I enjoy watching them dart to and fro, and love being serenaded by their repertoire of songs and calls. Cynthia hates that they are currently gorging themselves on her figs!

While I was watching them yesterday, I remembered the famous story about St. Francis who is said to have preached to the birds. Perhaps I will try it one of these days. What would the neighbors think?

Saint Bonaventure, in his *Life of St. Francis*, positions the story of Francis preaching to the birds right at the point where Francis wrestled with a deep personal dilemma. Should he retire from the world and devote himself entirely to prayer or should he continue to travel about as a preacher of the Gospel?

To answer this question, Saint Francis sent some of his brothers to seek the advice of a trusted friend, Sylvester, and his soulmate St. Clare. Word came back from both of them that he should continue to preach. Upon hearing their advice, Saint Bonaventure recounts, "without the slightest delay, Francis took to the roads to carry out God's command."

You might expect that Francis rushed off to the nearest village or town marketplace. But that is not what happened. According to Bonaventure, "Francis came to a spot where a large flock of birds of various kinds had come together. When God's saint saw them, he greeted them as if they were endowed with reason and solicitously urged them to listen to the word of God, saying, 'Oh birds, my brothers and sisters, you have a great obligation to praise your Creator, who clothed you in feathers and gave you wings to fly, provided you with pure air and cares for you without any worry on your part.' The birds showed their joy in a remarkable fashion. They began to stretch their necks, extend their wings, open their beaks and gaze at him attentively... None of them moved from the spot until the man of God made the sign of the cross and gave them permission to leave. When they had all flown away that pure and simple man began to accuse himself of negligence because he had not preached to the birds before."

Thomas of Celano, another biographer, tells the same story and adds, "From that day on Francis carefully exhorted all birds, all animals, all reptiles, and also insensible creatures, to praise and love their creator."

St. Francis firmly believed that all creatures form one family, so, that he would preach to birds makes sense. Why would he limit his audience to humans if God's love is just as much for other creatures? Francis grounded this belief in how he understood the incarnation. He had a great fascination for the feast of Christmas. The moment in history when God entered his creation sent shockwaves through it. God became one with all that he had made. He believed that Christmas should be celebrated by every creature. He petitioned the emperor to ask all citizens to spread grain along the roads on Christmas day so the birds could feast, and he encouraged everyone who had an animal in their care to give them a special meal. Francis' profound instinct was that the saving plan of God revealed in the child born in Bethlehem touched every part of

the created world. A modern Franciscan has said that Francis 'was not a human chauvinist!'

For now, I will spare my cathirds from my preaching, but when I hear them calling, I will no longer think they are serenading me, but singing their little hearts out in praise of the One who made them.
