#### Dear Friends,

Two weeks ago, the Pew Research Foundation published the results of their most recent survey of American church affiliation and practice. The article that first alerted me to the survey was in the WSJ. It had the worrying title, "Religion is on the Decline as More Adults check 'None'." 'None' is an option when asked, 'what is your religious affiliation?'

This was largely an on-line poll and is thought to be less accurate than the major polls which Pew conducted in 2007 and 2014. Nevertheless, the data is, on the face of it, disturbing for those of us who care about America's churches. It suggests that the percentage of adults who describe themselves as Christian has declined by 12% over the last decade and the share of Americans who say they attend religious services at least once or twice a month has declined by 7% over the same period. The decline is across all age groups but is highest amongst millennials, those born between 1981 and 1996 (23-year-olds to 38-year-olds). The decline in the number of millennials who say they are Christian is 16% and less than a third of them say that they attend church once or twice a month.

Needless to say, my attention was piqued this week when I saw this week's article in the NYT by Ross Douthat entitled, 'The Overstated Collapse of American Christianity'. I thought to myself, "maybe things are not so gloomy after all!"

Douthat's article allows for the fact that the trends are real but it raises three points that are specific to American Christianity which may suggest that America is not necessarily headed to the same level of secularism which defines Europe.

I will refer you to the article itself (<a href="https://nyti.ms/2pq3rXo">https://nyti.ms/2pq3rXo</a>) for Douthat's second and third points. I was particularly interested in his first point for which he used data from a similar, recent Gallup poll. This poll showed that what it called 'Lukewarm Christianity' is declining much more dramatically than 'Intense Religiosity', defined as attending church almost weekly. The Gallup poll showed that the decline in those who attend church almost weekly has only edged down slightly over the last ten years. Two sociologists that Douthat also cites have shown that the recent decline is almost entirely a function of those who have been weakly affiliated to churches. In the past, they and have attended Church only irregularly. Now they no longer attend at all. While I am not basing this on more than my awareness of who is in church on any given Sunday, I would guess that holds true at All Saints'.

Douthat also uses the Gallup poll data to show that today's churchgoing rate isn't that different from the rate in the 1930s and 1940s, before the postwar religious boom, and that the rate of decline in the 1960s was far steeper than we have experienced recently.

Before we feel too comforted by the Gallup Poll data, there are three things that should be challenging to us as a congregation.

First, All Saints' is not reaching millennials. It is too easy to say, 'but no-one is', even if the data bears that out. Even the evangelical community churches are experiencing the decline in

millennial attendance so trying to be, 'hip, casual, and accessible' is not the answer. Perhaps the model of Christians gathering on a Sunday morning for worship where success is measured by the size of the congregation will change altogether.

Second, all polls show that the most strongly affiliated generation is that which is called The Silent Generation, those born between 1925 and 1945, those who are currently between 74 and 94. The Boomers who came after the Silent Generation have never been nearly so committed to their Churches and are not replacing the Silent Generation as they die. At All Saints' we continue to benefit from the faithful attendance of many members of the Silent Generation. Without them our Sunday attendance, and our giving, would be significantly lower.

Third, while Douthat's point about the loosely affiliated being the primary cause of decline is well taken, all churches depend upon reaching those with whom they already have loose associations. Our efforts are far more likely to be rewarded if we can cement those associations rather than hope to reach those with whom we have absolutely no connection. We must be sure those on the periphery of our congregational life do not slip away altogether.

I do thank all of you who love All Saints'. Let's talk about the challenges that lie ahead of us and please pray that we may remain a healthy church in our service and witness.
