Weekday services are in St. David's Chapel. The lessons appointed for weekday Morning Prayer and Evening Prayer during the weeks following the fifth and sixth Sundays of Eastertide may be found on pages xxiv - xxv of the Book of Common Prayer. Propers for the Holy Communion of the Ascension of our Lord may be found in the BCP on p. 238. The Prayer Book calls the Rogation Days "Days of Solemn Supplication." They have, since ancient times been focused on asking God's blessing on agriculture, animal husbandry, and fishing. They are days on which the praying of The Litany (BCP p. 54) is especially appropriate. The abbreviations after St. Dunstan signify: B, bishop; and C, confessor. Fr. Brown will be traveling from May 13 until May 22, so there will be no weekday liturgies during that time other than those noted.

GOING DEEPER

Questions for Personal Reflection, Prayer, and Discussion

The Joy of Asking the Father

In today's gospel, Jesus promises that whatever we ask the Father in His name, He will give, so that our joy may be full—and He reminds us that the Father Himself loves us because we have loved the Son. In your current season of life (whether raising young children, building or sustaining a career, adjusting to an empty nest, or enjoying retirement), what are the “good things” you most need to bring before the Father in Jesus' name right now? How might shifting from anxious striving or self-reliant planning to confident, named prayer change the way you approach your responsibilities and hopes?

Peace Anchored in the Father's Love

Jesus acknowledges that in the world we will have tribulation yet calls us to be of good cheer because He has overcome the world, grounding our peace in the Father's personal love rather than our own strength or circumstances. Where in your life right now—perhaps in professional pressures, family dynamics, health concerns, financial decisions, or the quiet ache of changing seasons—do you most need this deep, settled peace? How could regularly remembering your identity as a beloved child of the Father, through Christ, reshape your inner response to the stresses and uncertainties that surround you? What do you *really* need from God?

Looking into Christ's Mirror

St. James warns that merely hearing the Word without doing it is like glancing in a mirror and immediately forgetting what you look like. As you look into the “perfect law of liberty” that is Christ Himself, what *specific* areas of your life currently show the clearest gap between what you affirm on Sunday and how you actually live on Monday through Saturday—whether in your work ethic, use of time and resources, fulfillment of duties, speech at home or in the office, or engagement with your community? What one concrete “doing” is the Holy Spirit prompting you to begin this week?

Practicing Pure Religion Daily

Pure and undefiled religion before God, St. James says, involves bridling the tongue, caring for the vulnerable (“visiting the fatherless and widows in their affliction”), and keeping oneself “unspotted from the world.” In our culture of constant communication, curated success, and subtle compromises for comfort or advancement, where do you sense the greatest need for growth in guarding your speech (including what you post, forward, or say flippantly or in frustration), extending personal presence and care to those who are struggling, and maintaining integrity when worldly values press in on your decisions? How might these practices become part of your regular rhythm rather than occasional good intentions?

Inspired to Think, Guided to Do

The Collect reminds us that all good things come from the Lord; and asks Him to grant us, by His holy inspiration, the grace both to think those things that are good and, by His merciful guiding, to perform the same. As you hold together the inner life of prayer,

sonship, and peace with the outer life of faithful doing, what good desire or plan has the Holy Spirit been stirring in you lately that needs both fresh inspiration and steady guidance, to move from thought to sustained action? How can you ask God's blessing on your daily labors—your parenting, your work, your service, your legacy—in the spirit of “Rogation” (Latin for “asking”)—trusting Him to bring it to fruitful completion?

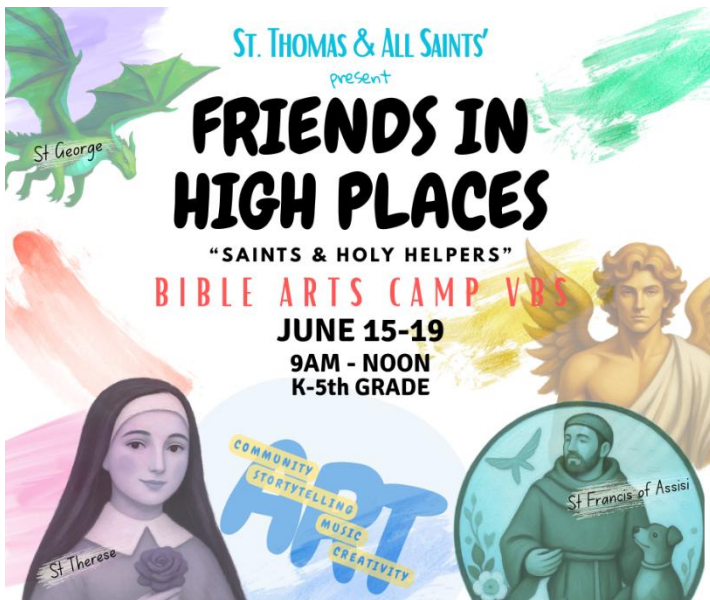
