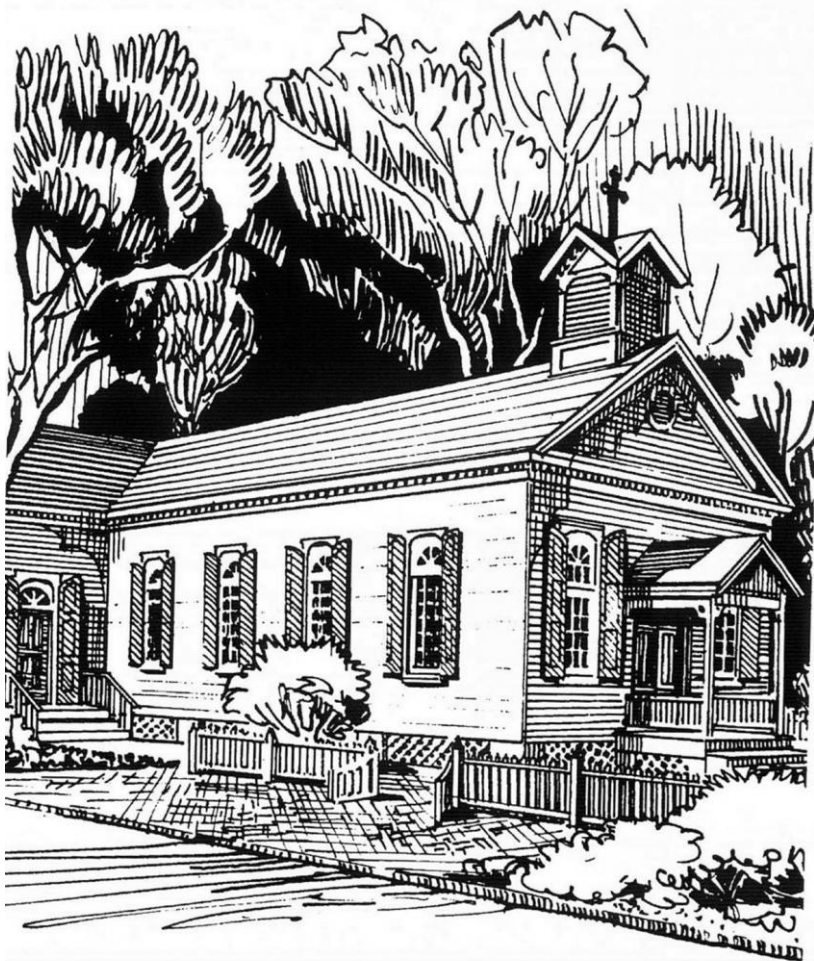

The Collect for the Third Sunday after Trinity

OLORD, we beseech thee mercifully to hear us; and grant that we, to whom thou hast given an hearty desire to pray, may, by thy mighty aid, be defended and comforted in all dangers and adversities; through Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen.*

The Epistle

1 St. Pet. v. 5.

ALL of you be subject one to another, and, be clothed with humility: for God resisteth the proud, and giveth grace to the humble. Humble yourselves therefore under the mighty hand of God, that he may exalt you in due time: casting all your care upon him; for he careth for you. Be sober, be vigilant; because your adversary the devil, as a roaring lion, walketh about, seeking whom he may devour: whom resist stedfast in the faith, knowing that the same afflictions are accomplished in your brethren that are in the world. But the God of all grace, who hath called us unto his eternal glory by Christ Jesus, after that ye have suffered a while, make you perfect, stablish, strengthen, settle you. To him be glory and dominion for ever and ever. *Amen.*

The Gospel

St. Luke xv. 1.

THEN drew near unto him all the publicans and sinners for to hear him. And the Pharisees and scribes murmured, saying, This man receiveth sinners, and eateth with them. And he spake this parable unto them, saying, What man of you, having an hundred sheep, if he lose one of them, doth not leave the ninety and nine in the wilderness, and, go after that which is lost, until he find it? And when he hath found it, he layeth it on his shoulders, rejoicing. And when he cometh home, he calleth together his friends and neighbours, saying unto them, Rejoice with me; for I have found my sheep which was lost. I say unto you, that likewise joy shall be in heaven over one sinner that repenteth, more than over ninety and nine just persons, which need no repentance. Either what woman having ten pieces of silver, if she lose one piece, doth not light a candle, and sweep the house, and seek diligently till she find it? And when she hath found it, she calleth her friends and her neighbours together, saying, Rejoice with me; for I have found the piece which I had lost.

(Verses 1 and 2)

Aurelia

Minister Hath this Child been already baptized, or no?

¶ If they answer, No: then shall the Minister proceed as followeth.

DEARLY beloved, forasmuch as our Saviour Christ saith, None can enter into the Kingdom of God, except he be regenerate and born anew of Water and of the Holy Ghost; I beseech you to call upon God the Father, through our Lord Jesus Christ, that of his bounteous mercy he will grant to this Child that which by nature he cannot have; that he may be baptized with Water and the Holy Ghost, and received into Christ's holy Church, and be made a living member of the same.

¶ Then shall the Minister say,

LET us pray. Almighty and immortal God, the aid of all who need, the helper of all who flee to thee for succour, the life of those who believe, and the resurrection of the dead; We call upon thee for this Child, that he, coming to thy holy Baptism, may receive remission of sin, by spiritual regeneration. Receive him, O Lord, as thou hast promised by thy well-beloved Son, saying, Ask, and ye shall have; seek, and ye shall find; knock, and it shall be opened unto you. So give now unto us who ask; let us who seek, find; open the gate unto us who knock; that this Child may enjoy the

everlasting benediction of thy heavenly washing, and may come to the eternal kingdom which thou hast promised by Christ our Lord. *Amen.*

¶ Then the Minister shall say as followeth:

Hear the words of the Gospel, written by St. Mark, in the tenth Chapter, at the thirteenth Verse.

Answer Glory be to thee, O Lord.

THEY brought young children to Christ, that he should touch them: and his disciples rebuked those that brought them. But when Jesus saw it, he was much displeas'd, and said unto them, Suffer the little children to come unto me, and forbid them not: for of such is the kingdom of God. Verily I say unto you, Whosoever shall not receive the kingdom of God as a little child, he shall not enter therein. And he took them up in his arms, put his hands upon them, and blessed them.

Answer Praise be to thee, O Christ.

¶ Then shall the Minister say:

AND now, we being persuaded of the good will of our heavenly Father toward this Child declared by his Son Jesus Christ; let us faithfully and devoutly give thanks unto him and say,

¶ Minister and People

Almighty and everlasting God, heavenly Father, We give thee humble thanks, That thou hast vouchsafed to call us to the knowledge of thy grace, and faith in thee: Increase this knowledge, And confirm this faith, in us evermore. Give thy Holy Spirit to this Child, That he may be born again, And be made an heir of

everlasting salvation; Through our Lord Jesus Christ,
Who liveth and reigneth with thee and the Holy Spirit,
Now and forever. *Amen.*

*¶ The Minister shall speak unto the Godfathers and Godmothers
on this wise.*

DEARLY beloved, ye have brought this Child here
to be baptized; ye have prayed that our Lord Jesus
Christ would vouchsafe to receive him, to release him
from sin, to sanctify him with the Holy Ghost, to give
him the kingdom of heaven, and everlasting life.

DOST thou, therefore, in the name of this Child,
renounce the devil and all his works, the vain
pomp and glory of the world, with all covetous desires
of the same, and the sinful desires of the flesh, so that
thou wilt not follow, nor be led by them?

Answer

I renounce them all; and, by God's help, will
endeavor not to follow, nor be led by them.

Minister

Dost thou believe all the Articles of the Christian
Faith, as contained in the Apostles' Creed?

Answer

I do.

Minister

Wilt thou be baptized in this Faith?

Answer

That is my desire.

Minister

Wilt thou then obediently keep God's holy will and
commandments, and walk in the same all the days of
thy life.

Answer

I will, by God's help.

Minister

Having now, in the name of this Child, made these
promises, will ye also on your part take heed that he
learn the Creed, the Lord's Prayer, and the Ten
Commandments, and all other things which a
Christian ought to know and believe, to his soul's
health?

Answer

I will, by God's help.

Minister Will ye take heed that this Child, so soon as sufficiently instructed, be brought to the Bishop to be confirmed by him?
Answer I will, God being my helper.

¶ Then shall the Minister say,

OMerciful God, grant that like as Christ died and rose again, so this Child may die to sin and rise to newness of life. *Amen.*

Grant that all sinful affections may die in him, and that all things belonging to the Spirit may live and grow in him. *Amen.*

Grant that he may have power and strength to have victory, and to triumph, against the devil, the world, and the flesh. *Amen.*

Grant that whosoever is here dedicated to thee by our office and ministry, may also be endued with heavenly virtues, and everlastingly rewarded, through thy mercy, O blessed Lord God, who dost live, and govern all things, world without end. *Amen.*

Minister The Lord be with you.
Answer And with thy spirit.
Minister Lift up your hearts.
Answer We lift them up unto the Lord.
Minister Let us give thanks unto our Lord God.
Answer It is meet and right so to do.

¶ Then the Minister shall say,

IT is very meet, right, and our bounden duty, that we should give thanks unto thee, O Lord, Holy Father, Almighty, Everlasting God, for that thy dearly beloved Son Jesus Christ, for the forgiveness of our sins, did

shed out of his most precious side both water and blood; and gave commandment to his disciples, that they should go teach all nations, and baptize them In the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost. Regard, we beseech thee, the supplications of thy congregation; sanctify this Water to the mystical washing away of sin; and grant that this Child, now to be baptized therein, may receive the fulness of thy grace, and ever remain in the number of thy faithful children; through the same Jesus Christ our Lord, to whom, with thee, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, be all honour and glory, now and evermore. *Amen.*

¶ Then the Minister shall take the Child into his hands, and shall say to the Godfathers and Godmothers,

Name this Child.

¶ And then, naming the child after them, he shall dip him in the Water discreetly, or shall pour Water upon him, saying,

Rowan Marshall, I baptize thee In the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost. *Amen.*

¶ Then shall the Minister say,

WE receive this Child into the congregation of Christ's flock; and do sign him with the sign of the Cross, in token that hereafter he shall not be ashamed to confess the faith of Christ crucified, and manfully to fight under his banner, against sin, the world, and the devil; and to continue Christ's faithful soldier and servant unto his life's end. *Amen.*

¶ The Minister shall put upon the Child the white vesture commonly called the Chrysom, saying,

WE give this white vesture, for a token of the innocency bestowed upon thee, and for a sign

whereby thou art admonished to give thyself to pureness of living, that after this transitory life thou mayest be partaker of the life everlasting. *Amen.*

¶ *The Minister gives to the newly baptized a lighted candle, saying,*

TAKE this burning light, and guard thy Baptism without blame; keep the commandments of God, that when the Lord shall come to the wedding, thou mayest go to meet him with all the Saints in the heavenly court, and live for ever and ever. *Amen.*

¶ *Then shall the Minister say,*

SEEING now, dearly beloved brethren, that this Child is regenerate, and grafted into the body of Christ's Church, let us give thanks unto Almighty God for these benefits; and with one accord make our prayers unto him, that this Child may lead the rest of his life according to this beginning.

¶ *Then shall be said,*

OUR Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy Name. Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done on earth, As it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, As we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation; But deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, for ever and ever. *Amen.*

¶ *Then shall the Minister say,*

WE yield thee hearty thanks, most merciful Father, that it hath pleased thee to regenerate this Child with thy Holy Spirit, to receive him for thine own Child, and to incorporate him into thy holy Church. And humbly we beseech thee to grant, that he,

being dead unto sin, may live unto righteousness, and being buried with Christ in his death, may also be partaker of his resurrection; so that finally, with the residue of thy holy Church, he may be an inheritor of thine everlasting kingdom; through Christ our Lord. *Amen.*

¶ Then the Minister shall add,

THE Almighty God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, of whom the whole family in heaven and earth is named; Grant you to be strengthened with might by his Spirit in the inner man; that Christ dwelling in your hearts by faith, ye may be filled with all the fulness of God. *Amen.*

CONFIRMATION

¶ Upon the day appointed, all that are to be confirmed shall stand in order before the Bishop, sitting in his chair near to the Holy Table, the People all standing until the Lord's Prayer; and the Rector shall say,

Reverend Father in God, I present unto you these persons to receive the Laying on of Hands.

Bishop Hear the words of the Evangelist Saint Luke, in the eighth Chapter of the Acts of the Apostles.

WHEN the apostles which were at Jerusalem heard that Samaria had received the word of God, they sent unto them Peter and John: who, when they were come down, prayed for them, that they might receive the Holy Ghost: for as yet he was fallen upon none of them: only they were baptized in the name of the Lord Jesus. Then laid they their hands on them, and they received the Holy Ghost.

¶ Then shall the Bishop say,

DO ye here, in the presence of God, and of this congregation, renew the solemn promise and vow that ye made, or that was made in your name, at your Baptism; ratifying and confirming the same; and acknowledging your-selves bound to believe and to do all those things which ye then undertook, or your Sponsors then undertook for you?

¶ And every one shall audibly answer,

I do.

¶ Then shall the Bishop say,

Do ye promise to follow Jesus Christ as your Lord and Saviour?

¶ And every one shall answer,

I do.

Bishop Our help is in the Name of the Lord;

Answer Who hath made heaven and earth.

Bishop Blessed be the Name of the Lord;

Answer Henceforth, world without end.

Bishop Lord, hear our prayer.

Answer And let our cry come unto thee.

Bishop *Let us pray.*

ALmighty and everliving God, who hast vouchsafed to regenerate these thy servants by Water and the Holy Ghost, and hast given unto them forgiveness of all their sins; Strengthen them, we beseech thee, O Lord, with the Holy Ghost, the Comforter, and daily increase in them thy manifold gifts of grace: the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of counsel and ghostly strength, the spirit of

knowledge and true godliness; and fill them, O Lord, with the spirit of thy holy fear, now and for ever. *Amen.*

¶ *Then all of them in order kneeling before the Bishop, he shall lay his hand upon the head of every one severally, saying,*

DEFEND, O Lord, this thy Child with thy heavenly grace; that she may continue thine for ever; and daily increase in thy Holy Spirit more and more, until she come unto thy everlasting kingdom. *Amen.*

¶ *Anointing each with Chrism upon the head, the Bishop shall say,*

ISIGN thee with the sign of the Cross, and I confirm thee with the Chrism of Salvation: in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost. *Amen.*

¶ *Then shall the Bishop say,*

Bishop *The Lord be with you*

Answer *And with thy spirit.*

Bishop *Let us pray.*

ALMIGHTY and everliving God, who makest us both to will and to do those things which are good, and acceptable unto thy Divine Majesty; We make our humble supplications unto thee for these thy servants, upon whom, after the example of thy holy Apostles, we have now laid our hands, to certify them, by this sign, of thy favour and gracious goodness towards them. Let thy fatherly hand, we beseech thee, ever be over them; let thy Holy Spirit ever be with them; and so lead them in the knowledge and obedience of thy Word, that in the end they may obtain everlasting life; through our Lord Jesus Christ, who with thee and the same Holy Spirit liveth and reigneth ever, one God, world without end. *Amen.*

OALMIGHTY Lord, and everlasting God, vouchsafe, we beseech thee, to direct, sanctify, and

govern, both our hearts and bodies, in the ways of thy laws, and in the works of thy commandments; that, through thy most mighty protection, both here and ever, we may be preserved in body and soul; through our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ. Amen.

¶ Then the Bishop shall bless them, saying thus,

The Blessing of God Almighty, the Father, the Son, and the Holy Ghost, be upon you, and remain with you for ever. *Amen.*

✠ *Weekday services are in St. David's Chapel. ✠ The lessons appointed for weekday Morning Prayer and Evening Prayer for the days following the 3rd and 4th Sundays after Trinity may be found on pages xxvi - xxix of the Book of Common Prayer. ✠ Propers for the Office of the Nativity of St. John Baptist are on (or near) p. xlv, and propers for Holy Communion of that feast are on pp. 242-244. ✠ Propers for the Office of St. Peter (and St. Paul) are on (or near) p. xlv, and propers for Holy Communion of that feast are on pp. 244-246. ✠ The initials after the names of saints signify: B, bishop; C, confessor; and M, martyr. ✠ The "Visitation" of St. Mary commemorates the events related in St. Luke 1:39-56. ✠ The "translation" of a saint marks the anniversary of that saint's relics being moved ("translated") from one place to another; in the case of St. Martin, from Candes, where he died, to the Basilica at Tours in 478 AD. ✠ Eucharistic propers for Independence Day may be found in the Prayer Book beginning on p. 263.*

GOING DEEPER

Questions for Personal Reflection & Prayer

The Gift of Desire

The collect acknowledges that God Himself has given us “an hearty desire to pray.” In what areas of your life—your work, parenting, leadership, or personal disciplines—do you tend to treat spiritual desire, moral effort, or religious consistency as something you generate or sustain by your own strength? How might it change your prayer this week, and your expectations of yourself and others, to receive even just the *longing* to pray as a gift from God, rather than something that comes from within you?

Casting Cares and Keeping Vigilant

The epistle urges us to cast “all your care upon him, for he careth for you,” while warning us to “be sober, be vigilant” because “your adversary the devil... walketh about seeking whom he may devour.” What cares are you most tempted to try to carry alone, or manage through your own planning and effort? How could the practice of humility, steadfast faith, and deliberately entrusting those cares to God bring the “defense and comfort” today’s collect mentions amid the particular dangers and adversities you face?

Clothed with Humility

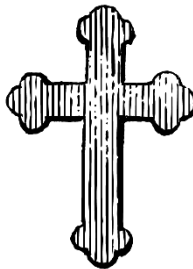
The epistle calls us to “be clothed with humility” and says plainly that “God resisteth the proud, and giveth grace to the humble.” Where in your professional life, marriage and family relationships, social circles, or church involvement do subtle forms of pride—reliance on your own competence, reputation, education, or “having it together”—most easily take root? What would it look like, concretely, to practice humility and mutual subjection in one of those spheres this week, and how might that open greater space for God’s grace?

The Seeking Shepherd

In the gospel, the shepherd does not wait for the lost sheep to return on its own but leaves the ninety-nine to go after the one until he finds it. How does this image of Christ's active, compassionate initiative challenge any tendency to assume that spiritual return, repentance, or closeness to God depends primarily on your own searching, effort, or moral progress? In what areas of your life do you most need to receive—rather than achieve—the Shepherd's pursuit?

The Light That Searches and Heaven's Joy

In the parable of the lost coin, the woman lights a lamp and searches diligently until she finds what was lost, and the gospel declares there is joy in the presence of the angels of God over one sinner who repents. How does viewing Christ as the Light who actively searches, together with the heavenly joy that greets even one act of repentance, influence the way you relate to your own struggle with sin and need for mercy? Where might you be tempted to question, withhold, or limit that joy when grace is extended in ways that unsettle your sense of order or fairness?
