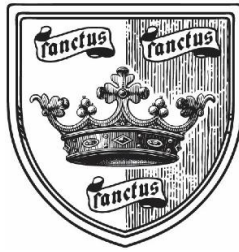

The First Lesson

I Corinthians 12:1

BCP 203*f*

CONCERNING spiritual gifts, brethren, I would not have you ignorant. Ye know that ye were Gentiles. carried away unto these dumb idols, even as ye were led. Wherefore I give you to understand, that no man speaking by the Spirit of God calleth Jesus accursed: and that no man can say that Jesus is the Lord, but by the Holy Ghost. Now there are diversities of gifts, but the same Spirit. And there are differences of administrations, but the same Lord. GOING DEEPER

Questions for Personal Reflection & Prayer

Praying for What Pleases God

The Collect prays that the Lord's ears would be open to our prayers, and that we may be made to ask such things as please him. In lives shaped by genuine responsibilities and the desire to provide well for those entrusted to us, our prayers can quietly become shaped more by what we think we need than by what God knows will draw us deeper into his divine life. Bring before the Lord one petition that has occupied your heart lately. Ask the Holy Spirit to purify your asking, that it may arise less from pressure or self-will and more from the humility that truly desires what pleases God.

Jesus Is Lord

The Epistle declares that no one can say that Jesus is the Lord but by the Holy Ghost. We call Jesus "Lord" in the Creed and in our liturgy, yet the same Holy Ghost who enables this confession also intends to claim the entirety of our lives for Christ's lordship. In settings where faith can remain somewhat compartmentalized (whether at work, in your family, or just the management of daily life), there is an opportunity for honest self-examination. Find a quiet moment this week to return in prayer to the simple words "Jesus is Lord," and spend a few moments repeating them slowly. Ask the Holy Ghost to search your heart and show you any area—time, money, ambitions, or relationships, etc.—where this confession remains more an outward profession than a living reality. Ask the Holy Ghost to draw you into a deeper surrender to Jesus as your Lord.

Gifts for the Profit of All

St. Paul teaches that there are many kinds of spiritual gifts, but the same Spirit gives them all, and that the manifestation of the Spirit is given to everyone for the common good. Whether the gifts entrusted to us appear prominent or hidden, big or little, all are sovereignly distributed by the one Spirit for the building up of the whole Body of Christ. In a community such as ours, full of capable people accustomed to pitching-in and contributing visibly, comparison or the quiet undervaluing of less obvious gifts can arise without our noticing. In prayer, thank God for the particular way the Holy Spirit has gifted you. Ask Him for eyes to see and honor the gifts he has given to others, trusting that he "divideth to every man severally as he will," always for the common good of his Church.

The Gift of Tears

Our Lord wept over Jerusalem because she knew not the time of her visitation, and she couldn't see the things that appertained to her peace. Christ's tears spring from a love that sees both the peace we so often miss and the hardening of heart that can turn opportunities for mercy into judgment. Even when we're immersed in the life of the Church, with its liturgy, sacraments, and clear teaching, our own hearts can remain strangely dry, distracted, or hardened against the very grace that seeks to visit us in mercy. The spiritual "gift of tears" has a very deep pedigree in the tradition of the Church. In the stillness of prayer, ask the Holy Spirit—who softens hard hearts and grants the gift of tears—to give you true compunction, flowing from sorrow over sin and love for Christ. Ask that it may cleanse what has grown dull within you, and open you more fully to his presence in the "temple" of his Church.

A Den of Thieves

In the temple our Lord declared, "My house is the house of prayer; but ye have made it a den of thieves," and he drove out what profaned its purpose— St. John's gospel (chapter 2) even says that Jesus used a whip and flipped over the tables. The same Christ still visits his Church, and each believer's heart, to reclaim what rightly belongs to his Father. In the press of daily life and even within our religious activity, secondary concerns or allegiances can displace prayer without our full awareness. Ask the Lord to let your heart be his temple. Ask him, by the cleansing power of his Spirit, to show you what is lodging there that doesn't belong, and ask him to cast it out, restoring in you a simpler and deeper devotion to the sacramental and liturgical life that forms us in his likeness.

These reflection questions are the work of Fr. Brown, with assistance from artificial intelligence; and the Liber Meditationum of Pseudo-Augustine.
